Requirements

Candidates must be current UCLA Anderson School of Management MBA or FEMBA students and demonstrate the following skills and abilities:

- Energy and enthusiasm

About our Programs

UCLA Head Start Management Fellows Program (HSMFP)

This national training program designed to develop and strengthen the entrepreneurial management skills of Head Start executives who provide comprehensive services to nearly 1 million economically disadvantaged children and their families each day. Conducted by the Price Center, the program was sponsored previously by Johnson & Johnson from 1991 to 2015. At the conclusion of the 2019 program, 1,600 Head Start executives have completed the training.

Professor Alfred E. Osborne, Jr., who is currently the senior associate dean at UCLA Anderson, serves as the faculty director of this program.

UCLA/Johnson & Johnson Health Care Executive Program (HCEP)

Since 2002, this national training program has helped build the entrepreneurial competence of executives from community health centers (CHCs) and other community-based organizations (CBOs), as well as enhance their capacity to expand the quality and quantity of care, treatment and support delivered to underserved and vulnerable populations around the country. The HCEP is specifically designed and especially valuable for organizations to plan for and/or implement shifts in their organizational strategies to confront the new environment for health care delivery.

Noah Goldstein, professor of management and organizations at UCLA Anderson, serves as the faculty director of this program.


Hybrid Format

Candidates for the strategic consultant position must be available to participate in both iterations of the HSMFP and the HCEP.

Optional for Fall 2022

MBA students who serve as strategic consultants for the HSMFP and HCEP this year are eligible to also serve as a teaching associate for the **UCLA/J&J Community Health Advocate Management Program (CHAMP)**, which was specifically designed for managers and supervisors of community health workers (CHWs).

Modeled after the HCEP, the CHAMP aims to help CHW managers and their supervisors create and sustain improvements in their organizations, with the ultimate aim of improving the health and wellness of their communities.

The CHAMP will be held virtually for six consecutive weeks, from September 28 through November 3, 2022. Sessions will be held on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. PT, 12:00 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. ET.

Students selected to be strategic consultants for the two (2) Head Start Management Fellows Programs and the Health Care Executive Program will earn \$13,000.

Participation in the Community Health Advocate Management Program (CHAMP) scheduled for Fall 2022 is an additional \$2,500.
