Below are seven attractions showcasing the diverse and captivating essence of the city, from beautiful viewpoints to iconic movie locations.



Griffith Observatory: Visitors may look through telescopes, explore exhibits, see live shows in the Samuel Oschin Planetarium and enjoy one of the best views of Los Angeles and the Hollywood Sign. Admission is free.

Rodeo Drive: The three blocks of Rodeo Drive just north of Wilshire Boulevard in Los Angeles make up one of the most famous streets in the world. The street is known for its collection of ultra-high-end designer and boutique shops, and has been featured in more than a few films.
